



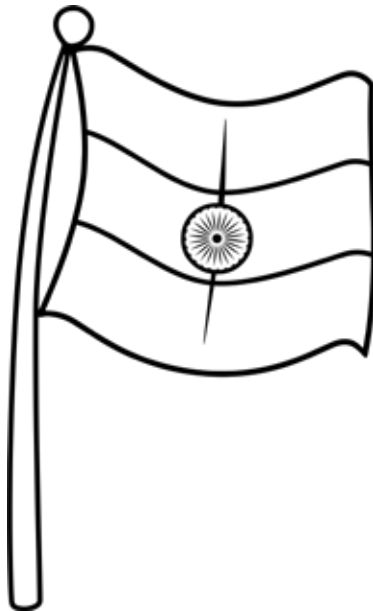

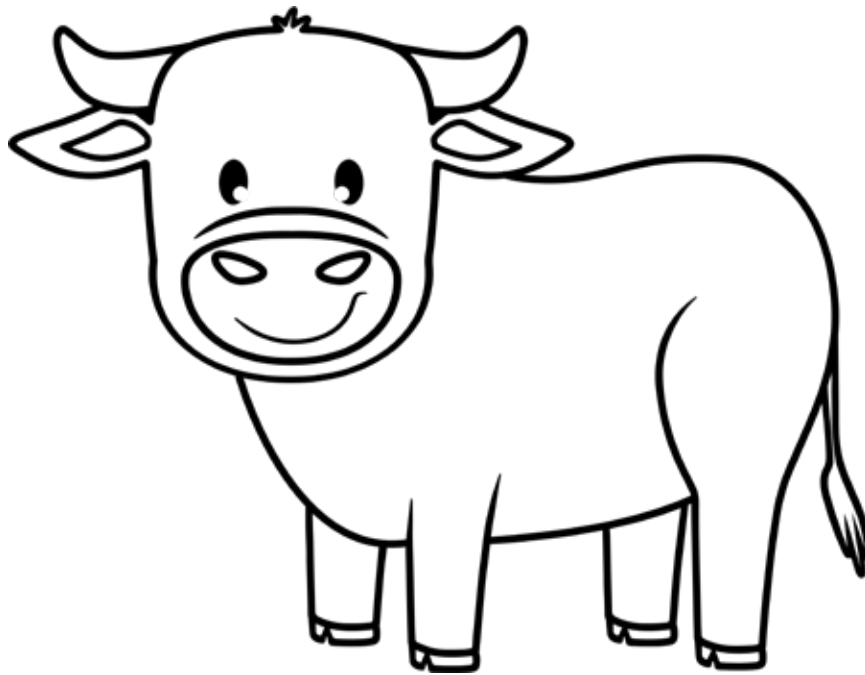
India is part of the continent of Asia. Most of India forms a peninsula, which means it is surrounded by water on three sides.



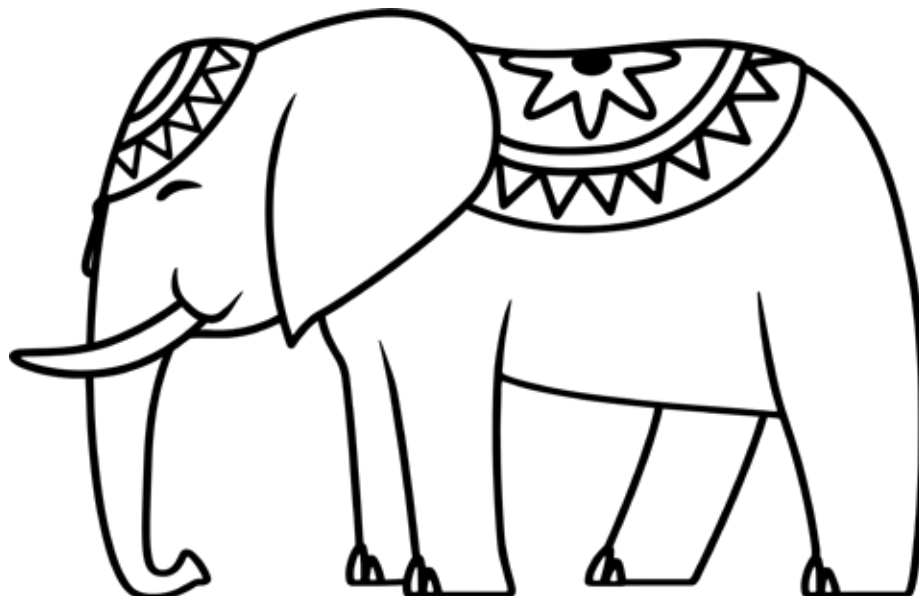
India is a very spiritual country. It has no official religion, but more than 80 percent of Indians are Hindu.



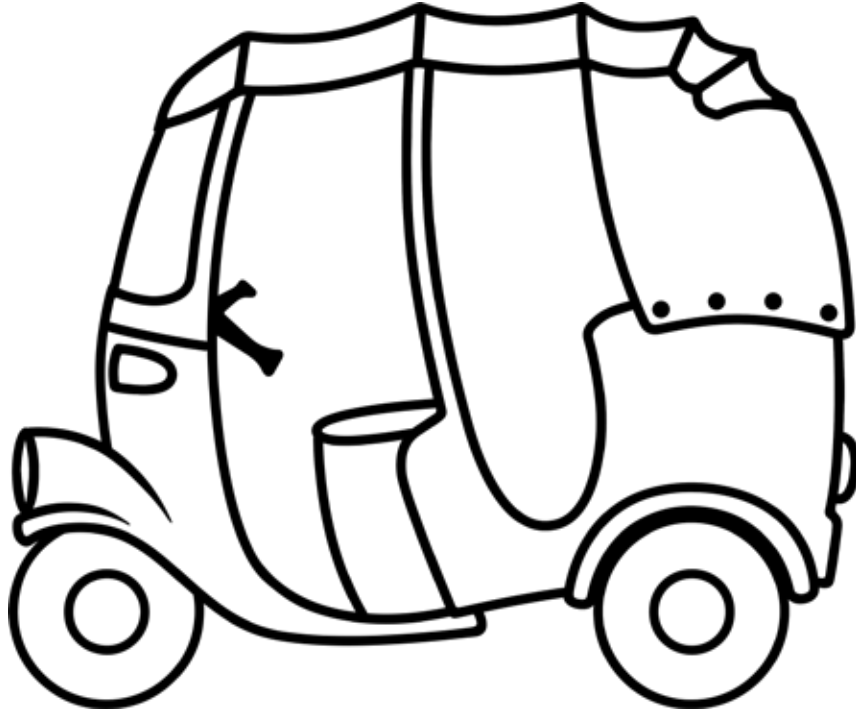
The Indian national flag, known as the Tiranga, is a horizontal tricolor with deep saffron on top, white in the middle, and dark green at the bottom



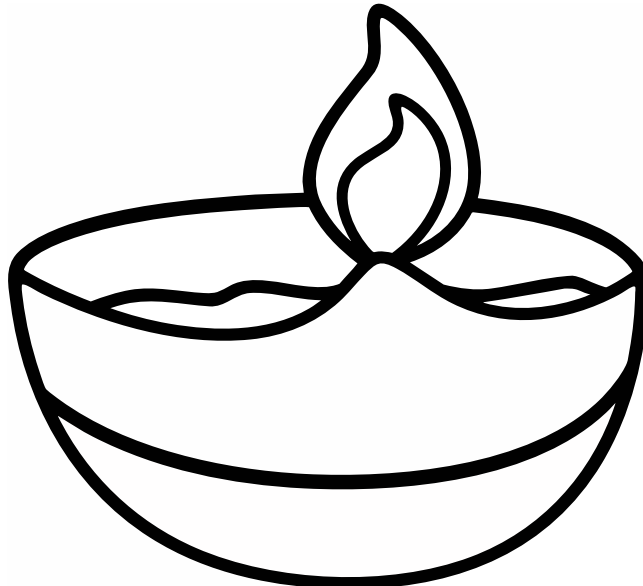
Cows are of special significance in particular. They are considered sacred and cannot be harmed



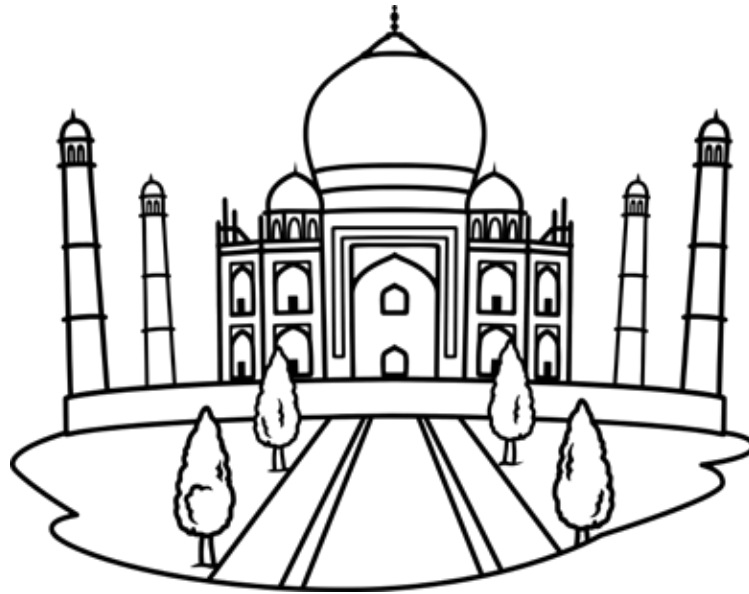
India is home to many large mammals such as the snow leopard, the Indian rhinoceros, the Bengal tiger and even the Asian elephant.
